Meth has become his cruel **Task-Master**, not the relief he was searching for!

As is often the case with "drug stimulate" users, this young man experiences *long periods of depression; "meth" has become his self-medicating escape if only for a few

hours. "There is a path that seemed right to a man." Tragically, this young man's future is *very uncertain* and needs your prayers; his life is an example of the many choices for deceptive escapes presented in the world for all of us! Certain areas in our lives can seem overwhelming and out-of-control at times, and we need a friend to help us talk and think through our options and possibilities! At times, all of us are in need of a **Coach/Mentor** to talk to; someone who has our best interests at heart and has earned the right to speak into our lives because of a trusting relationship; how many kids who are in serious trouble do you know who have access to such a "COACH"?

Here at Southern Colorado YFC, during the month of May, we are conducting a 16- hour training for our volunteer staff in the basics of Coach/Mentoring; equipping our staff to better empower the kids we encounter ever week *to live the life they were meant to live* and become a life-long follower of Jesus Christ! Dopamine is involved in reward, motivation, the experience of pleasure, and motor function. Methamphetamine's ability to release dopamine rapidly in reward regions of the brain produces the euphoric "rush" or "flash" that many users experience. Repeated methamphetamine use can easily lead to addiction; often after only one use a cycle of chronic relapsing characterized by compulsive drug seeking and continual use.
